What is Google Hangouts on Air (HOA)?

A live video call/Broadcasting tool available via Google+.

Can I participate in the upcoming Google HAO?

- If you like watching more than reading, here is the best introduction to being a
 <u>Google HOA guest that I could find (it is a video, of course!)</u>. Otherwise, here is
 my written introduction to participating:
- In order to participate, you must have a Google mail account (gmail) or have a
 Google+ profile. If you would like to participate in our HOA but are not a
 Google user, you can sign up! Google has many amazing products beyond
 their famous search engine. You can read more about your options here.
- Follow the Britta Lafont Google Plus page by adding me to your circle.
- A few minutes before the scheduled hangout, go to Google+, find the Britta Lafont Google+ page and look for the hangout on the stream for the page, then (double) click on the play button to join.
- Once you enter the Hangout, you will be able to see the other participants and they will be able to see you. You microphone will be muted in order to keep background noise to a minimum.
- If you want to participate in the discussion, there will be a chat box on the right where you can type in your questions. You can also ask questions ahead of time by contacting me through the webpage contact form or the FaceBook Bible Study page.

What if I am not a Google user and don't want to become one?

- You can still watch the event live on YouTube.
- Find the YouTube link on the group FB page or the <u>Come Study with Us</u> informational page at brittalafont.com.
- You can ask questions ahead of time by contacting me through the webpage contact form or the FaceBook Bible Study page.

Awesome Attributes:

- The conversation is aired on YouTube simultaneously so anyone who has access to YouTube can watch it, live.
- The conversation is recorded so you can watch it on YouTube after it has aired.
- You can interact with the presenters in real time.

Limitations:

- You must have a Google+ account to participate in the Q&A.
- Only 10 people can participate at one time.
